COFFEE WITH PASTOR GERALD

As I write this I'm sitting in my home office, it's 6:47am (which feels early, even with coffee), I'm sipping my coffee, and thinking about what 2026 may look like. It's as if I can see the door opening to this year, being invited in, yet what's on the other side of the door appears as though I'm looking through a bathroom window. You know, the kind where you can see shapes and the movements of what's on the other side, but you can't quite tell what it all is – and honestly, maybe you're not sure you want to.

While sitting with that image, looking through the 2026 door, these words from the Apostle Paul just came to mind: For now we see as through a glass, dimly, but then, face to face. Now I know in part, but then I shall know, even as I also am known. (1 Corinthians 13:12, MEV) He's reminding us that right now we don't see everything clearly, that it's like looking through a bathroom window, and then doing the best we can with what we see.

We know some things about God, about ourselves, and about what 2026 will hold. But all of it is partial, unfinished, and to some sobering degree – all uncertain. As we step into a new year, it's both humbling and hopeful: God already knows us fully, is already ahead of us, is already standing in the middle of our 2026 bringing both encouraging and comforting presence depending on our day-to-day need.

So, as we enter this new year together breathe, sip some coffee, abide in God's presence, and then embrace the moments on the other side of the door – even if they're a little blurry at first.



A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR RICK

Dear Hope Family,

There's something about the start of a new year that softens us. We look back at where we've been, and we feel the weight and wonder of where God has carried us. As Bobbi and I step into this new year, our hearts are full—and a little tender—as we share what God has been doing in our lives.

Nine years ago, God called us to Hope in a way that was unmistakable. We didn't come with a plan—we came with trust. And over these years, God has met us here again and again. We've watched Him change lives, heal hearts, restore hope, and draw people to Himself—many who never imagined church could be a place for them.

When I first stepped into leadership, I was given a clear and compelling vision: "Help us create a church that reaches churched and unchurched people." That vision grabbed my heart because helping people find and follow Jesus isn't just what I do—it's who I am. Serving here hasn't been a job; it's been a calling. A joy. A privilege.

Over the past five years, God has also been quietly stretching our faith. While serving full-time at Hope, He opened doors for me to walk alongside Christian universities, churches, and organizations—helping leaders grow healthier, teams become stronger, and people engage more deeply in their God-given mission. What started small kept growing. And eventually, it became clear that God was inviting us into something new.

This past summer, I shared with the Church Council that those opportunities continue to increase. After months of prayer, long conversations, and many emotional moments, we came to a difficult but peaceful conclusion: I can't give my full "yes" to what God is calling me into next while continuing to serve full-time at Hope.

With that, we've let leadership know that January 11, 2026, will be my last Sunday at Hope. Choosing that date mattered deeply to us. We wanted to walk through Christmas together—to worship, celebrate, and remember the miracle of Jesus' birth as one family. And we wanted Hope to begin the new year with strength, momentum, and hope—because God's story here is far from finished.

As Bobbi and I step into this next season, we ask you to pray for us—but more than that, we ask you to send us. Not away, but forward. We go with humility, dependence on God, and deep gratitude for what He has done through this church.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR RICK

We truly believe that as we step into this new assignment—serving churches, universities, and organizations—Hope shares in the impact. Every leader strengthened, every team renewed, every mission clarified is an extension of the ministry that began right here. We don't go on our own. We go carrying Hope's heart, Hope's values, and Hope's commitment to helping people find and follow Jesus.

Hope Church will always be home. This is the place that shaped us, trusted us, and sent us out. You have been part of our formation, and you will forever be part of our story. What God does next through us is not a departure—it's multiplication.

A new year is a reminder that God is always doing something new. And just as He clearly called us here nine years ago, we trust Him with what's ahead. We step forward with confidence, not because we know all the details, but because we know the One who does.

Thank you for loving us, believing in us, and walking this journey with us. As we go, we go sent—and we go with you.



THE Mostly TRUE STORY OF TANNER & LOUISE by Colleen Oakley



Since she has no credit or money to speak of, her options are limited, so when an opportunity to work as a live-in caregiver for an elderly woman falls into her lap, she takes it.

One slip on the rug. That's all it took for Louise Wilt's daughter to demand that Louise have a full-time nanny living with her. Never mind that she can still walk fine, finish her daily crossword puzzle, and pour the two fingers of vodka she drinks every afternoon. Bottom line: Louise wants a caretaker even less than Tanner wants to be one.

The two start off their living arrangement happily ignoring each other until Tanner starts to notice things—weird things. Like, why does Louise keep her garden shed locked up tighter than a prison? And why is the local news fixated on the suspect of one of the biggest jewelry heists in American history who looks eerily like Louise? And why does Louise suddenly appear in her room, with a packed bag at 1 a.m. insisting that they leave town immediately?

Thus begins the story of a not-to-be-underestimated elderly woman and an aimless young woman who—if they can outrun the mistakes of their past—might just have the greatest adventure of their lives







Winter 2026: "Embodied prayer" by the Rev. Liv Larson **Andrews**

Esther Circle continues to meet every 2nd Wednesday of the month. This month we meet on January 14th at 9:30am- 11:00am in Meeting Room #4.

Monday Night Study will meet January 19th and February 16th from 6:30pm - 8:00pm in Meeting Room #6

Prayer is an important part of our relationship with God, and one of the ways we respond to God speaking in our lives. At the same time, we may carry all kinds of baggage or heavy questions about prayer: Am I doing it "right?" Do I pray enough? Is prayer always done with words? This two-part Bible study looks to Scripture as a guide to explore some different ways we can pray with our bodies—and with the body of the earth.

(January) Session One: Praying with our bodies

Looking to the Apostle Paul, Mary, the Psalms and more, we'll learn about and try three embodied practices of prayer based on breathing techniques, the use of beads (such as the rosary) and praying in different postures (sitting, standing and kneeling).

(February) Session Two: Praying with the body of the earth

Scripture inspires us to regard the natural world as both sacred space and our neighbor. This session explores ways we can pray not only for creation but with creation as our sacred neighbors. As we pray, even the trees and rivers are our prayer partners. The session concludes with the glorious vision in Revelation 22 of a restored world and the river of life.


