- Sunday, Nov. 2nd, 10:45 a.m. or 11:45 a.m. in Room #2, an informal learning about Legacy of Hope at Hope Lutheran and how I might participate. Rev. Steve Olson will lead the conversation and provide helpful information.

SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Search Committee continues to work hard at finding a new lead pastor for Hope Lutheran. We have looked closely at fourteen people as potential candidates for the lead pastor, unfortunately we either eliminated them from consideration or they chose to withdraw from continuing the call process. We've learned that within the ELCA there exists a shortage of clergy to fill the needs of Lutheran churches across the country. On September 23 we met with Bishop Dave Nagler to hear the challenges that the synod office has had in identifying suitable candidates for Hope. He assured the members of the committee that Hope Lutheran is a dynamic, forward looking church that should be a desirable call for a pastor. However, he also shared that potential candidates are hesitant to move to the desert, some are concerned about the cost of living in California, some do not want to leave extended family at their current location, some have spouses that are also engaged in a career that would be impacted by a major move. We continue to search the country for potential candidates.

The makeup of the committee has also changed. We've welcomed two new members, Tom Clayton and Aubrey Pradetto. Pastor Gerald Sharon will be leaving the committee as he transitions to being the Bridge Pastor for Hope. He will continue to serve as an advisor to the committee, much as Pastor Tom and Pastor Rick have served as advisors. Rick Hart will serve as the new chairperson for the committee, replacing Martha Osborne.

Finally, if you know of a potential pastor that might be a candidate for Hope Lutheran you can confidentially give the name to one of our pastors who will provide the name to the synod office or to the pastoral search firm we are working with. We ask for you continued prayers as we continue this important journey for Hope.



AFRICAN ASYLUM SEEKERS INITIATIVE





HOPE BOOK CLUB

The Hope Book Club for October will be reading William Kent Kruger's "Lightning Strike," a pitch perfect, richly imagined story that is both an edge-of-your-seat thriller and an evocative, emotionally charged coming-of-age tale.

We are introduced to Cork a 12 year old boy from Aurora, a small town nestled in the ancient forest alongside the shores of Minnesota's Iron Lake.

When Cork stumbles upon a body of a man he revered hanging from a tree on the Indian reservation at Lightning Strike, it is the first in the series of events that will cause him to question everything he took for granted about his hometown, his family and himself.

"Lightning Strike" explores the tender relationship between father and son. It is written with grace and understanding.

This is a wonderfully laid out crime novel with a message of truth and justice in a coming of age story. Cork and his family, and everyone in this novel must grapple with the battle between their heads and hearts.


HOPE FOOD PANTRY

Quilts are distributed during the winter months to our ministry partners and in the spring to our High School Graduates.


This year our ministry partners are:





We welcome our new team members to this mission.


