SHOWING UP!

What always excites me about Easter are the 50 days following Easter leading up to Pentecost Sunday, the birth of the Church. The stories of Jesus showing up behind locked doors, Jesus showing up on the Road to Emmaus, Jesus showing up at a picnic along the Sea of Galilee. etc. I love the quote; "90% of life is showing up"! The Good News of Easter is that Jesus shows up 100%!

I am excited that both our Modern and Traditional Worship Services are synergizing around the common theme of "One Church", because that is what we are! We will be taking devices to Kenya next summer to share with people from Sudan who are in refugee camps. —Pat Leach

After devastating Hurricanes Milton and Helene struck, your generosity helped deliver 10 shipping containers of our Lutheran World Relief Quilts and other health items to hard-hit areas across North Carolina, Florida, Mississippi and Tennessee in record time!

Edward Lynch served our nation in the Persian Gulf as a United States Marine. As he worked to rebuild his life, he moved into the Veterans Restoration Quarters, which provides relief services for veterans who do not have homes. When Hurricane Helene struck, the entire shelter was flooded — causing all 165 residents to find themselves searching for home ... again. Thankfully, your compassion reached these service members with comforting quilts — wrapping them in love when they needed it most. Edward shared: "When I lost everything, this is one of the first and nicest things I got and it gave me something to hold onto in the midst of a crisis."

LWR has also shared quilts in Los Angeles County after the devastating fires.


PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY







Memorial Garden at Hope...

Have you noticed that Hope Lutheran Church has brought the cemetery back to the church grounds? Historically, Christians have laid their dead to rest in churches, where they are remembered and their remains safe-guarded. Burial within the church itself, or in an adjacent churchyard cemetery was once a common practice. Our Columbarium now provides parishioners a final resting place within church grounds, and offers a wonderful place to remember loved ones. Every Sunday family and friends of those interred take a moment to thank God for their loved ones with a brief prayer in the Memorial Garden. The Columbarium is located just a short walk past the Woehrmann Fountain on the left, across the plaza from Hope Center. Come and experience the Columbarium first hand.

Summer 2025: "Where two or more are gathered: Flourishing in relationships" by the Rev. Brooke Petersen

(June) Session One: Relationships that form us: All in the family Some of our most beloved Bible stories involve siblings and the trials and tribulations of relationships within families. We'll examine the stories of Jacob and Esau, as well as Mary and Martha, while considering what we learned in our own families about relationships. These biblical characters will help us to explore how our early family relationships shape how we think about the everyday relationships in our lives.

(July) Session Two: Relationships that sustain us: Where you go, I will go One cannot get far in this life without encountering suffering, loss, betrayal and tragedy show up in our own lives and in the lives of those we love. In this Bible study, we will explore the story of Naomi and Ruth, two women who held fast to their relationship in the face of great loss. With this in mind, we'll consider what helps us to stay in relationship with others when we face seasons of grief and suffering in our own lives and the lives of others.

(August) Session Three: Relationships that push us to grow: For such a time as this Relationships aren't always comfortable. There are times when we find ourselves navigating the painful work of growing and changing in our relationships. This session explores the story of Queen Esther and her uncle Mordecai. How can we draw on the stories of our faith when we face great challenges in our lives and relationships with others? We'll explore how vulnerability, trust and the power of faithful friendships help us to grow.
