Week Two

Week Three

Jonah
Jonah 1:1-3:10

Jonah goes God's way and tells the people in Ninevah about God after Jonah goes his own way and is swallowed by a big fish.

The prophet Elisha told Naaman to wash in the Jordan River to heal his skin.

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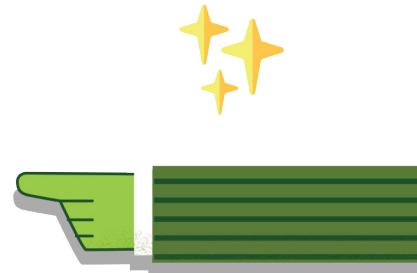
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Preschool

ENGAGE IN EVERYDAY MOMENTS TOGETHER



Morning Time

When you go into your child's room, look around and say: "Good morning! I'm looking for someone that God loves. [His, her] name is [name of child], and God loves [him, her] a lot! Oh! There you are!" (Cuddle with your child after you "find" them.)



Cuddle Time

Cuddle with your child and pray: "God, I believe You love [name of child] and me A LOT, and because You love us, You will always want what is best for us."



Drive Time

While on the go, look for gardens. Flower gardens, vegetable gardens, small box gardens . . . any kind of garden! Talk about how Adam and Eve learned that God knows what is best for us in a garden called Eden.



Bath Time

Add toy vegetables, fruits, flowers (whatever you have) and a watering can to bath time. Encourage your child to pretend to work in their garden. Talk about how Adam and Eve lived in a garden called Eden and God knew what was best for them.



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
