# A NOTE FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

And Jesus came and said to his disciples, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded to you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

I love the way Matthew ends his telling of the story of Jesus. Perhaps "ends" isn't the right word, because the story is clearly not finished. There is a command, a propulsion, a feeling of momentum that leads us to believe that the work of Jesus continues in a meaningful way. "Go therefore and make disciples", and "Remember, I am with you always." Matthew leaves us with a sense that this is simply the end of a chapter, not the end of the story.

The chapters of Jesus continue to be written each and every day. While the cast may change, the director stays the same – Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. And this Jesus is not working behind the scenes. He is right here, actively participating in the work of his disciples – you and me.

I am amazed at what Jesus accomplished through you in 2023. Because Jesus is at work, our Children's and Student Ministries continue to grow. Our Hope Children Center, which provides before and after care for the students of Washington Charter School, is at full capacity, with dozens of children hoping to be a part of what our Director, Virginia, has put together. Therefore, we have undergone a project to expand HCC by adding two additional classrooms. This means that we will have the opportunity to tell almost thirty more children about Jesus. It brings me such joy to see our HCC kids playing in our Sanctuary and even helping out with our Altar Guild.

There is one story that I would like to share that I think sums up what HCC means to our next generation. One day, three children were playing "wedding" in the Sanctuary when I walked in wearing my alb and stole. They asked if I would be the pastor for their wedding while another little one played the piano. I agreed and we all had a lot of fun. After the "ceremony", the little one playing the piano approached me and said, "I'm sad." "Oh no, why are you sad?" I replied. "Because I really want to be baptized here at Hope, but my dad said I can't until I'm 18", she told me while looking at the floor. I said, "How about this? We can both pray that your dad changes his mind and you can be baptized sooner. If not, you can be baptized right here the day you turn 18." The sadness from her face immediately disappeared and she exclaimed with a big smile, "Really! I would love that!" Then she skipped away with Mrs. Virginia and the other students. At that moment I could tangibly feel the Holy Spirit at work in our Hope Children Center, and with the addition of our Children's Ministry Director, Carlos Vega, I know Jesus is changing lives.

You can feel that same Spirit at work in our Bible studies: Men's Bible Study, Sisters in Christ, Esther Circle, and our Online Bible study. With our Online Bible Study, people can join us from far and wide to dive deep into the Scripture, and have a little fun with my crazy theories.

Jesus is clearly at work in our Stephen Ministry Program. Tootie Killingsworth leads our Grief Share that is helping people cope with the grief left by a loved one's death. While Susan Sommerfeld, Linda Benson Spencer, Bob Bateman, Karen Anschell, Bob Kramer, and Sandy McGinnis have served as leaders for our group. Our Stephen Ministers are always available to walk with people through challenging times in their lives, reminding us all that Jesus is with us always.

Our Legacy Committee is also working under the leadership of Jesus to ensure that, as people of Hope, we are able to make a lasting impact. Lynn Hendershot, the chair of our Legacy Committee, has brought a tremendous energy to our efforts growing our Endowment Fund which supports exciting ministry opportunities every year.

Kim Buchanan has also put together a Long Term Planning Committee that is asking where Jesus wants us to focus our time, talent, and treasure in the future. This group of dedicated Jesus followers is doing wonderful work of discerning where God is leading Hope.

Hope has also been committed to Read With Me this year. Horst Engel has done a tremendous job of leading our volunteers who dedicate a couple of hours each week to help children at Saul Martinez Elementary School learn to read. It has been a blessing to those children and to those who volunteer alike.

And clearly, Jesus has been at work through your generosity. With our Let's Do It! Campaign, generous donors gave \$400,000 in matching funds with the challenge to Hope to match it. And we did it! Thanks to many gifts, we were able to pay off over \$800,000 from our mortgage. However, we still have a way to go to being entirely debt free and I know Jesus will be leading the way.

None of this could be possible without our amazing leadership. Our Hope Council has continued to follow Jesus and lead Hope where God wants us to be. Mary Fay Pinnow, Reynold Worch, Rick Greaves, Martha Osborn, John Donnelly, Kim Buchanan, and Toni Hafey are being led by the Spirit and our future is bright with their leadership.

God has also gifted Hope with ana amazing staff that I am extremely thankful for: Pastor Rick, Pastor Carl, Pastor Gerald, Gabe, Doug, Virginia, Michael, Manny, Angel, Gesa, John, Christina, Carlos, Terry, Nick, and Barb have all been amazing.

Yes, the story of Jesus continues. The story of Hope continues. Even amid the changes that life places before us. As you may know, my time serving as your Senior Pastor will come to a close this year. My wife has been offered a new position in Park City, Utah and after much prayer and careful discernment, we have decided to accept. Therefore, our family will be relocating to the Rocky Mountains.

Our Congregational Council is already in consultation with Bishop Dave Nagler and the Pacifica Synod to create a smooth transition and set up an organizational structure that will ensure Hope continues to share the grace, love, peace and joy that we find in Jesus Christ. While change can often create some anxiety, we know who leads the way – Jesus. Jesus has the next chapter for Hope already mapped out with limitless possibilities.

So I would like to take this time to thank Jesus and thank each of you. The compassion, kindness, generosity, love and support you have shown me and my family over the years could only come through the work of the Holy Spirit. Hope has been, and will continue to be, a special place where the joy and love of Christ is felt, and that has everything to do with you. I have said it many times before, and I will continue to say for the rest of my life, there is no place like Hope. God has richly blessed you with the Holy Spirit, and I can promise that God will continue to shower His grace upon the people of Hope Lutheran Church. I am excited to see where Jesus leads us next.

#### TEACHING PASTOR

The ministry of Hope is filled with vitality and life that was expressed throughout our church in 2023. Part of sustaining vitality includes often making challenging decisions regarding the launching of a new ministry and at times celebrating the success of a ministry while bringing it to a close.

During 2023 our Ministry Fair on January 22nd had 28 ministries represented. The courtyard was abuzz that morning with smiles and laughter, engaging conversations, people connecting with new friends and discovering ways to be involved in this exceptional church family.

Our online daily devotionals that began on March 16, 2020 continued well into 2023. As we watched the trends, we knew it was time to celebrate all the good they'd done, and how many lives had been touched, but to also bring them to a close. The last daily devotional was on September 29. That day we shared our 915th devotional!

This year also saw multiple opportunities for learning and growth. Dr. David E. Garland led us through a weekend in the parables. Dr. Paul Lange and Dr. Ted Peters took us on an insightful journey in our 3-week series on "Religion and Science."

2023 saw the development of a new ministry that was launched in December 2022 called Hope for All. It is specifically intended for LGBTQ+ and Allies to have opportunities for outreach and to receive ministry. Among several significant ministry events and opportunities by this ministry, the highlight of the year was that Hope had a booth for the first time at Palm Springs Pride. Nearly 30 people from Hope volunteered, and hundreds upon hundreds of individuals stopped by our booth to get a free photo and to register for the quilt we were giving away that had been so beautifully designed by our quilting ministry. This gave us an opportunity for wonderfully meaningful conversations letting people know they are deeply loved and cherished by God and they are welcome and wanted at Hope, a safe and inviting church for them.

Finally, 2023 was a year that led me to the most significant decision of my pastoral career. Through a processes of discernment I was led to the decision that I will be retiring on August 12, 2024 which will be my 45th anniversary of being a pastor.

A little over 7 years ago, in order to follow a grand vision, the good and gracious people of Hope made the decision to take a chance on a pastor who had left the evangelical church tradition and was being drawn to the ELCA's expression of the Lutheran faith tradition. Over those 7 years this pastor's heart became so deeply connected to you and the church that I pursued a process of becoming ordained and rostered by the ELCA. During my years of pastoring I experienced a broad national and international platform, yet these 7 years have been the highlight of my ministry. I finally found my faith home. Because Hope is my home you'll still be seeing me around and involved, just not as a staff member.



#### HOPE CHILDREN CENTER

Another successful and rewarding year of spreading the word of Jesus to our elementary school aged children – ages 4–10. Leading by example that we are never alone, Jesus is alway with us! I have witnessed several children sharing thoughts and statements with another child "Jesus is with you!! We read our Daily Reflections for Kids every morning. We follow the reading with meaningful conversations, shares, and funky original art!

You may have noticed that we have a new welcome entrance/exit for our families! We now sign in and out at the Hope Center. Our children, their families and our staff can experience added security with the well lit parking lot. Along with the lighting we now have a greeter, air conditioning, and parents who can get more acquainted with our Hope Center. On that note, we brought in twenty new families to our Christmas Eve service! Families who weren't sure about where to go on Christmas, and who were delighted to spend the holiday here at Hope as their children participated in our Candlelight Silent Night and We Wish You a Merry Christmas.

Hope Children Center continues to hover around the 100 mark on our roster. Our hours are 6:30am-6:00pm. To better serve the community, we started a Kinder Program for children who are dismissed at 1pm. We provide child care until 3pm and offer a lower rate so they can be picked up at 3pm with their older siblings' dismissal time. We are open most non school days, and provide special fun days like Pancake Pajama Day and Friday Quesadillas.

Our growing garden continues to thrive! This year we have tomatoes, pumpkins and lettuce! The children have found lady bugs and monster caterpillars! We make our own salads and talk about where our healthy food comes from.

All in all we are providing quality child care for our Palm Desert Community with love, compassion and originality not found at any other child care center!

#### **WORSHIP AND MUSIC COMMITTEE**

A congregation that is fully alive like ours seeks lay involvement, especially in its worship life. Many ELCA congregations involve lay people in worship, by encouraging them to work with the pastors and other staff through worship committees. We express our gratitude to Pastors Derek Fossey, Carl Witt, Gerald and Gesa Sharon, and Rick Bailard, our organist Doug Wilson, and our choir director Michael Cundari.

The worship committee works on the assumption that worship is a unifying event in the life of a congregation. It is the one time when all members come together for a common purpose-to worship and thank God for God's grace given to all in Word and Sacrament. Our members work to assist the worship service through our lay leaders who are all volunteers.

These volunteers are a vital resource in the church to support the various areas necessary to keep our worship services running smoothly and effectively. Our ministry is composed of volunteer lay leaders who work "behind the scenes" and "in the scenes" before, during, and after the services. Some volunteers are more visible than others, but the work each does is extremely crucial to the purpose of a productive, Godbased worship observance. On any given Sunday there are anywhere from 30-50 volunteers working.

Our volunteer coordinator, Cindy Willenberg, compiles the data from all the various groups and displays them on a monthly easy-to-read chart posted on a bulletin board for all participants to view. There are too many volunteers to mention by name, so their areas of expertise and a brief description of the duties they perform will be given.

- Scripture readers—read the Biblical texts
- Greeters—greet worshippers at church entrances
- Ushers—ministers of hospitality who collect offerings, direct communicants, seat worshippers
- Altar Guild-prepare communion bread and wine
- Hope Chorale—heart of our music ministry
- Bell Choir—playing bells from time to time
- Audio/visual technicians—volunteers who are trained and regulate microphones and lighting, display service on big screen
- Communion assistants—help prepare and serve the bread and wine during communion
- Coffee and donut servers—hospitality providing refreshments before and after services
- Flower deliverers—rearrange and deliver flowers to shut-ins

#### **CELEBRATE RECOVERY**

Celebrate Recovery is a Christ-centered, 12-step recovery program for anyone struggling with hurt, pain, or addiction of any kind and is a safe place to find community and freedom from the issues that are controlling our lives.

In February, CR celebrated its 5th anniversary. CR continues to meet every Thursday night at 7:00pm in the Hope Center. It is important to understand that 3 out of 10 people attend CR for alcohol or other chemical addictions. Here are some examples of other areas of recovery that CR addresses:

#### Some examples are:

- Anger
- Codependency
- Eating Disorder
- Financial Recovery
- Food Addiction
- Gambling Addiction
- Love & Relationship Addiction
- Physical- Sexual- Emotional Abuse
- Sexual Addiction
- Grief
- Anxiety
- Low Self Worth

The weekly Thursday night program includes a Large Group meeting, with live worship and either a recovery specific lesson or a testimony by someone who has experienced healing through Celebrate Recovery. Gender specific Open Share Groups and a time of fellowship called Hope Café follow the Large Group.

Midweek small groups called Step Studies, work through a Celebrate Recovery 4-workbook curriculum. CR started 3 and completed 2 Step Studies in 2023. Most of these are being held on Zoom.

It's been an exciting year of rebuilding leadership and regrowth of the ministry. It has been encouraging to see new leaders being raised up plus an increase in attendance on a regular basis.

Blessed to be able to hire a teacher to lead the weekly program for children age 3 through 5th grade, Celebration Place was able to reopen early on in the year. When offering this program, the whole family is able to participate.

Some on the leadership team are involved in community outreach events sharing about CR, educating people about the danger of fentanyl poising and the use of Narcan to save people from overdose.

To stay connected and encouraged the team had leaders' meetings throughout the year, but also several fellowship events. Ten leaders attended the annual "Summit" conference at Saddleback Church in Orange County, we held our annual corn hole event for all leaders, volunteers and their families, plus a fun Christmas luncheon at church.

Thank you to the pastors and congregation of Hope for their tireless support. The team is encouraged by the continuous life-change that occurs in people's lives due to the tools of CR and the grace of God, and is excited to continue to serve our church community and beyond to provide a safe place to heal from life's struggles and challenges. We hope you will come check it out one Thursday night.

The Legacy Committee of Hope Lutheran Church Palm Desert is chartered to promote and encourage gifts and bequests to the Endowment Fund and to serve as trustees of the Fund. The principal of the Fund is held in perpetuity; only its distributions are used to support the Church's mission and ministry activities that would not otherwise be possible within the church's operating budget.

Because of generous gifts made to the Endowment Fund and a positive stock market this year, the value of the Endowment Fund increased from \$150,241.75 to \$218,568.95 as of December 31, 2023. These funds are invested in Value Line Asset Allocation (VLAIX), held at Schwab. As the Endowment Fund balance increases, the annual distribution back to the church increases!

# LEGACY COMMITTEE (Continued)

In 2023, a total of \$6,000 was awarded for the following to provide community outreach work beyond the operational budget, including spiritual and mission growth, and for improvements to the physical facilities:

- Bark replacement to keep the children safe on the playground of the Hope Children Center
- A professional camera lens to enhance the Online Ministry
- A contribution to the Needy Family Fund for the Saul Martinez and Peter Pendleton Schools
- Hope for All for their first presence at Palm Springs Pride to spread Jesus' love to all
- A computer for the Kids & Students Ministries for planning, communicating & creating program

This year the Legacy Circle of Hope grew to 37 members. This Circle was created to honor those who have advised the church that they have chosen to leave a legacy that reflects their faith, values, and commitment to Hope Lutheran Church's mission to future generations. #### **READ WITH ME**

Our 10th year as sponsors of Saul Martinez Elementary School in Mecca was another great success. We had 29 dedicated volunteers who spent over 900 hours. volunteering at various grade levels.

Read with Me in conjunction with the Riverside Office of Education continues to provide complimentary bus service for our volunteers on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from Palm Desert to Saul Martinez from November until April. However, most volunteers prefer to drive themselves.

Hope also sponsors Peter Pendleton Elementary School in Coachella, where Kristi Ricker is the volunteer coordinator. A total of 13 volunteers spent more than 400 hours. volunteering at Peter Pendleton.

The mission of Read with Me is to help students with the English language, reading and comprehension. Our volunteers sign up for one or two days each week for about 2 hours each day. Some of our volunteers spend most of the school year tutoring, but most spend about 2–3 months during the winter at the school.

Read with Me is a local non-profit volunteer organization. Including Saul Martinez, and Peter Pendleton, our volunteers are in 22 elementary schools in the Coachella Valley. In addition to volunteering, we have distributed more than 4,000 age-appropriate books to the students at Saul Martinez and Peter Pendleton. These books are given to the students to own and take home for their personal use.

Later in the year Ruth Fikes, also the leader of the Quilters of Hope ministry joined our team. She has added joy, wisdom and creativity to our meetings and decision-making. We're blessed to have such a wonderful team with a beautiful variety of gifting who love serving together and support one another in their calling.

We thank Barbara Savery for leading the "Esther Circle" Bible study, Julie Fremstad the "Sisters in Christ" book study, and Gesa Sharon the "Monday Night" Bible study. We also had three Saturday morning Summer Studies hosted by different presenters.

We achieved our goal of actively engaging in action by continuing to support a multitude of local nonprofit organizations, missionaries, a local church after the Maui fires, and ELCA Disaster Relief financially. We handed out hand knit hats, collected hygiene items and assembled "Hope Bags" for the homeless in the valley. With the annual "Angels of Hope" Christmas gift outreach we were able to provide Christmas gifts for 300 children of 6 different elementary schools in the valley. We're thankful for the generosity of the congregation and the volunteers who came alongside us and helped make these projects possible.

In February we had our two annual fundraisers, Thankoffering Sunday, and registration for active participation in the Tour de Palm Springs. We also held our Women of Hope Winter Gathering with a guest speaker sharing about her experience of growing up as a farmer's daughter in the Coachella Valley. We had live music, food and our annual prayer partner reveal and exchange.

We had three fun "Girl's Night Out" throughout the year. Our hostess Stephanie did a wonderful job guiding us through creating a mosaic in May, a painting in August and Christmas ornaments in November. Thank you to Brenda Devlin for your ongoing commitment to help make these evenings a big success.

In November we hosted our Fall Gathering and Boutique with 10 local vendors, enjoying some shopping, brunch and introducing the no-profit "Team Rubicon." All these types of events are always encouraging seeing women spend time together in community.

With each year we grow more thankful in the many ways the women at Hope and the whole congregation support our mission to offer community amongst the women in our church and community. This is a huge encouragement to the Women Of Hope leadership team as we look back and as we plan ahead for 2024.

# TREASURER'S REPORT

The year ending December 31st, 2023, was another positive financial year for Hope Lutheran, Palm Desert.

Revenue or gifts to the church were up by 20.4%. However, this requires some explaining. Our revenue from tuition from the Children's Center contributed \$298,871. Our members offering envelopes remained about equal to the prior year at \$1,349,347. Total expenses were up in the amount of \$143,579 year over year. We continued to maintain and add to the outreach to our community and the world with our online ministries as well as several new ministries locally.

The other sizable increase in our revenue came from the debt relief matching campaign that kicked off in November of 2022. We received \$379,669 in a combination of matching funds and building funds throughout the year. This was utilized to retire debt. This left a net positive result for the church of \$435,059 against a prior year surplus of \$361,262. This year's results stated above include debt service expense.

A few comments to explain some of the expense numbers:

Our Benevolence payments to the Synod amounted to 5% (\$79,235) of our member offering envelopes. An additional \$5636, was given to local charities that support the community as well as restocking our new food pantry.

The Category "Campus Support" decreased over the prior year. However, within that result we continued to fund reserves that we can count on in the future as economic conditions change and our campus requires additional repairs. Our rainy-day reserve is funded to just above \$90,000. There are again many maintenance projects that were accomplished during the year.

The Category Pastoral staff, and non-pastoral staff increased 2.1% recognizing the human capital requirements to support the online ministries and the Children's Center as well as the ongoing growth of our on-campus ministries. As of note 42.9% of our total expense is our people.

Another highlight is the continued reduction of debt. We began the year with a debt of \$1,355,021 and ended the year with a debt balance of \$671,511, a reduction of \$683,510. We have a reset of our interest rate on 4/30/2025 and it is our hope and our goal to extinguish the debt prior to the reset date. By reducing our debt in the last two years by over \$800,000 we have been able to reduce our monthly payment from \$10,264 to \$4,204.

# TREASURER'S REPORT (Continued)

Our mortgage debt remains the elephant in the room, so to speak, from a financial perspective. Retiring this debt would create a sustainable mission environment for Hope for many years to come. This is of the highest priority financially.

Another significant accomplishment of your church was the continued support of our Legacy/Endowment fund. Through gifts of our parishioners we were able to invest and accrue a balance of \$208,569 in this fund. The committee continues reaching out to our parishioners to consider leaving a portion of their estate to the church. In turn the fund will contribute a percentage of the funds balance each year to fund special or unanticipated/unbudgeted projects or missions.

As we enter 2024, we have constructed a budget approved by the church council to manage the church in a similar fashion to which we have this prior year. We did anticipate that our member giving would increase by 6%. Our ordinary expenses increased by 3%. We will adjust wages by the COLA published by the bureau of statistics for Riverside County and anticipate that it will be around 3%. We have included rebuilding of the rainy-day fund to replenish it to the prior year's balance of \$220,000. This fund sustains the church's ordinary operating costs through the summer months.

It is worth noting that the church did receive significant unanticipated gifts in the year that supported many individual missions and the general operating costs of the church. We did budget that these unexpected events of gratitude will continue.

I would like to thank the finance committee for their guidance. (Lynn Hendershot, Paul Meinhold, Bernice Muller, Dave Vickers, and Kent Shultz). Each receives detailed financial reports monthly for their review and comment as well as the budget detail. We meet on an as needed basis.

Lastly, we have an ongoing operating process review headed by Kent Shultz and Dave Vickers. They independently choose areas of the church processes that can have an impact on the financial condition of the church or an operating process that can be streamlined or made more efficient. They examine the process and with the input of the process owners, and make recommendations for improvement.

#### PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

As my service commitment on the Church Council comes to an end, I would like to express my appreciation to the staff, Pastors, Council Members and the many volunteers who put in countless hours into making Hope Lutheran Church a welcoming place to find and follow Jesus.

We are approaching a period in time where several major components such as HVAC units, asphalt, sound systems, lighting, etc. need to be replaced. Planning for the replacement or repair of these larger components often takes a bit of juggling when it comes to funding. Thankfully, God always provides us with a path.

In 2023, several improvements were made at the Children's Center. The shade cloth over the play area was replaced, new bark was put down in both play areas, picnic benches were purchased, and synthetic turf was installed as well as new lighting along the walkway.

Due to supply chain issues, we continue to wait for the large HVAC unit to be replaced in the sanctuary. Hopefully, it will be here and installed very soon. The parking lot asphalt will be repaired and cracks filled the beginning of April with a complete seal coat and striping applied a couple weeks later. We are hoping to replace the sound system and lighting (stage lighting) in the sanctuary this year. It's a costly venture, but greatly needed. The Council continues to look into the feasibility of installing a solar energy system.

All this is in addition to maintaining the campus (including the Children's Center) on a regular basis. The maintenance not only includes cleaning, but also setting up and tearing down for events and services, overseeing vendors for maintenance and repairs, handyman work and many other miscellaneous chores. Our Facilities team lead by Manny Marinez does a terrific iob at maintaining the campus.

Give us the ability to adapt to the cultural, economic and social changes that occur in the neighborhoods we serve.


#### Receive our prayer, O God.
